**BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF JOB DUTIES:**

**Clinical Service:** Maintains a clinical practice at a University of Florida's women's health clinic, providing direct delivery of psychological assessment, psychotherapy, and consultation-liason. As a member of the infertility group, sees all couples preparing for *in vitro* fertilization as well as all individuals involved in third party reproduction (i.e., oocyte donor candidates, recipients of donor sperm or oocytes, and gestational host surrogacy candidates and commissioning couples) for psychological consultation. Sees patients referred through obstetrics and gynecology for psychological assessment and treatment for a range of difficulties, including prenatal anxiety, post-partum depression, and more general psychological difficulties. Serves as the supervising psychologist to graduate student and pre-doctoral intern trainees conducting therapy with adults with a range of presenting problems.

**Research:** Serves as data coordinator for NIH-funded grant examining lifestyle intervention for obesity. Has responsibility for data management, data analyses, and preparation of semi-annual summaries of study progress and events for the NIH Data Safety and Monitoring Board. Provides supervision to graduate students in design and maintenance of databases and research processes. Contributes to manuscripts and presentations. Provides research mentorship through work on master's and doctoral committees.

**Teaching:** Provides clinical teaching and supervision to graduate students and interns. Provides clinical training in psychotherapy for a broad range of cases. Offers clinical training in women's health through both a core practicum rotation and an advanced practicum. Teaches one section of an undergraduate Abnormal Psychology class and co-teach a graduate course on Clinical Assessment Across the Lifespan each year.

The course is divided into two modules: a psychological/adult module led by Dr. Durning and a child/cognitive module taught by a co-instructor.
