Appendix B: Course summaries

University of Florida

CLP 6527/6528 (4 credits each, Fall/Spring 2003-present, annual) Measurement, Design and Statistics I /II. Course involves integration and interaction among research design, tests and measurements, and statistics. Topics include scientific method, internal and external validity, principles guiding the design, conduct, and evaluation of measures, and interpretation and dissemination of statistical results, distributions and central tendency, inference making, general linear model and its embedded simple statistical procedures (evaluation and comparison means, correlation, regression, one- and multi-way analyses of variance with both between- and within-subjects factors), robust and non-parametric methods, power analysis, logistic regression/odds ratios and associated designs, and reliability theory (evaluation of reliability and validity, scale construction, item analyses). The course also considers ethical issues in the conduct of research with humans, as well as IRB guidelines and submission procedures. Format: Two 2-hour lectures per week; Flipped learning beginning Fall 2013/Spring 2014

CLP 6529(M); formerly numbered CLP 7934 (3 credits, Spring 2001, 2003, 2005, 2007, 2009; Annual in Fall from 2009-present) **Applied Multivariate Methods in Psychology.** This is an advanced graduate methods course. The course provides detailed instruction in MANOVA, repeated measures analyses, discriminant functions, mixed effects models, factor analysis, and structural equation modeling. Format: One 3-hour lecture per week; Flipped learning beginning Fall 2014

CLP 7525(C) formerly numbered CLP 7934 (3 credits, Spring 2008, 2010, 2012, Annual in Spring from 2014-present) **Best Methods for the Analysis of Change.** This is an advanced graduate methods course which focuses on the analysis of change in repeated measures (i.e., longitudinal, intervention, and intensive longitudinal) designs. Techniques considered include reliable change, standard error of measure, the multi-level model for change, structural equation approaches to lower- and higher-order growth models, and survival/event history analyses. Format: One 3-hour lecture per week; Flipped learning beginning Spring 2015

CLP 7934 (3 credits, every Spring from 2023-present) **History of Psychology**. This directed reading course explores the history of psychology, beginning with a critical orientation to the relativism of historical records, psychology's contribution to structural racism, and challenges in recounting contributions of members of historically excluded groups. Topics include: psychology and science, philosophy of mind, functionalism, measurement, applied psychology, gestalt, behaviorism, the unconscious mind, phenomenological and existential psychology, clinical psychology and mental health, and qualitative perspectives. Format: Online

CLP 7934(N) (3 credits, every semester Spring 2011-Fall 2012; Summer 2012-Fall 2021; Summer and Fall semesters beginning 2023) **Neuropsychology of Aging**. This directed reading course introduces students to contemporary theory, method, and findings regarding normal cognitive aging, neuropsychology (based mainly on research with brain-damaged individuals) and cognitive neuroscience. The readings will consider normal and pathological cognitive changes, potential etiologies and comorbidities, as well as recent thinking on intervention

approaches for late life cognition. The selection of topics and instructors also reflects the unique profile of expertise among University of Florida Division of Neuropsychology faculty. *Format: Online*

CLP 7934(A) (3 credits, Spring 2002, 2004, 2006) Very Late Life/Cognitive Aging. This is an advanced graduate seminar. This course explored psychological development in the very late years (after age 80). The course provided foundational information on cognitive, self and personality, social, and mental health changes in later life. Subsequent modules considered specific investigations of the very old, major theoretical underpinnings of this work (e.g., dedifferentiation, terminal decline), and current theoretical and empirical scholarship on the concept of successful aging. Format: One 3-hour seminar per week

Wayne State University

PSY 749 (3 credits) **Psychological Development in Later Adulthood**. This is an advanced graduate seminar focused on psychological development in later adulthood, and I specifically redesigned the course to reflect current state-of-the-art research in three domains of psychological aging: cognition, self and personality, and social relations. The course is also taken by many students in nursing and education who have development psychology as a cognate area, and by registrants in Wayne State's Certificate in Gerontology. Format: One 3-hour lecture per week

PSY 815 (3 credits) Multivariate Methods in Psychology This course deals with applied multivariate statistical methods in psychology. As I have re-designed the course, the course takes a strong workshop approach, with strong emphasis on running and interpreting analyses. Following introductory material, the course covers: (1) Multivariate analysis of variance and its extensions, and (2) Factor analysis and its extensions. The course is mainly taken by psychology graduate students, although it is also a magnet course for other methodologically inclined students. Format: Two 2 -hour lectures per week

PSY 240 (4 credits) **Introduction to Life-Span Developmental Psychology.** This is an introductory level course in life-span human development. It is taken by most psychology majors, and it is required for nursing and physical therapy and occupational therapy majors. It also attracts many non-psychology majors who are curious about the way people grow and change across the life-span. *Format: Two 2 -hour lectures per week ** Undergraduate course*

The Pennsylvania State University

HDEV 200 (3 credits) **Empirical Inquiry in Human Development**. Introduction to the skills involved in critical thinking in general and the methods of empirical inquiry in particular. Format: Three 1-hour lectures per week. ** Undergraduate course

Appendix C. Research Narrative/Personal Statement

Research

Impact: My research has two primary foci and three secondary foci, detailed below. Our work on cognitive interventions, including the first National Institute on Aging behavioral clinical trial for such interventions, has had a strong influence on the field. Our (Woods, Cohen, Marsiske) recent multi-site directly builds on this earlier trial. Both AAA and AARP have adapted one of our training arms for consumer dissemination. Two major systematic reviews have identified our ACTIVE trial as best-in-field (in terms of research design) for cognitive interventions, and the strongest study to date ("moderate quality evidence") regarding interventions to reduce cognitive decline. Our measures of everyday cognition (Everyday Problems Test, Observed Tasks of Daily Living) have been used as outcomes in many recent trials.

Primary focus one: Cognitive interventions with older adults. Beginning with my baccalaureate and Masters degree work, my work has focused on strategy training and practice interventions to improve fluid intelligence in older adults. The largest (and ongoing) study has been the NIA-funded ACTIVE multi-site clinical trial, of which I am a Principal Investigator. In over 2,800 older adults, we showed that cognitive training in memory/reasoning/processing speed could yield improvements in trained domains that lasted at least ten years. Moreover, while transfer of training was narrow, self-reported everyday functioning showed attenuated age-related decline in adults who received training. Other work (funded by NIA, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, and the McKnight Brain Institute) has explored collaboration in natural dyads, prompting/reminding, action video games, multi-factorial treatments (e.g., exercise plus computerized training) and, recently, mindfulness instruction as approaches for improving late life cognition.

Primary focus two: Measurement of "everyday cognition" in older adults. This work, which started with my dissertation, aims to answer the "so what" question in cognitive aging. How do we reconcile that apparent declines in the underlying cognitive process often seem to have little functional impact on elders' maintenance of everyday independence? Theoretical speculation has argued that older adults may invoke compensatory domain-specific knowledge built up through years of experience. But our work (with Sherry Willis, Jason Allaire, Manfred Diehl, Anna Yam, Kelsey Thomas and, recently, Jacob Fiala) suggests that the rate of decline in everyday cognition may parallel that seen for traditional measures of cognition (and be predicted by underlying executive function declines). As such, there may be a growing vulnerability in the ability to perform novel but important tasks (like medication use), even before clinically significant declines are observed.

Secondary focus one: Health disparities and community outreach. Race-related disparities in cognition, the resulting differences in trajectories of cognitive aging as a function of disparities, and the underlying health antecedents of these disparities have been consistent through-lines in my research. The interest in race stemmed from opportunities (my site in the ACTIVE clinical trial included approximately 75% African American participants) and collaborators (most notably Adrienne Aiken Morgan, Joshua Owens, Carolyn Tucker, but also Laura Zahodne, Oanh Meyer, Shannon Sisco and Kelsey Thomas). I was Core Leader for the UF NIA-funded Pepper

Center for its first decade. In that role, I also successfully recruited functionally diverse elders into many of our clinical trials.

Secondary focus two: Applied longitudinal methodology. Progressing from two decades of training advanced graduate statistics (in coursework covering regression and ANOVA through mixed effects, structural equation analysis and survival analysis), my work has largely focused on the applications of growth modeling/mixed effects models and intensive longitudinal designs in many recent publications. I also direct the Data Analysis/Management Core for the NIA-funded 1Florida ADRC, where we are now applying these longitudinal approaches to the prediction of cognitive impairment. I also support other studies with data analysis.

Secondary focus three: Transitions from normal aging to mild cognitive impairment to dementia. Several themes emerge in this line of research: (a) the creation, identification and norming of measures and tools to aid in the early identification of cognitive impairment; (b) exploring whether cognitive impairment moderates intervention-related improvements in memory and executive function.

Publication impact. As documented elsewhere in this document, I have published 148 peer-reviewed articles, 1 monograph, and 15 book chapters. I have given 33 paper presentations, 28 invited presentations, and 134 poster presentations. The impact factor of the journals in which I publish, using Journal Citation Report statistics, ranges from 0.81 to 56.27 (average=4.28, median= 3.25, standard deviation=6.71). Google Scholar metrics (https://scholar.google.com/citations?user=sTcbtg8AAAAJ&hl=en&oi=sra) report that my work has been cited 18,590 times, with an aggregate h-index of 59 and i-10 index of 140. Since 2019, Google Scholar reports 6,477 citations, an h-index of 39 and an i-10 index of 114.

Education and Training

Teaching responsibilities: I have served as instructor of six graduate courses (four in research design/measurement/statistics, one in cognitive aging, one in history of psychology). Since arrival at University of Florida, I have been instructor of 74 sections of these courses. In my statistics classes, I have taught 929 students in 2298 registrations (i.e., many students registered for more than one semester). The overwhelming majority of rated courses were above department mean evaluations.

Mentoring/advising: Current and past graduate and postdoctoral trainees are shown in Appendix E below. I have also continuously supervised undergraduate research assistants in either paid or for-credit (CLP 3911, PSY 3912) positions. I also supervised four Honors Theses since 2007, all in Psychology: Michelle Paggi (2007), Amber Hathcock (2007), David Marra (2011), and Annika Goldman (2017). All four students progressed to graduate programs in psychology or medical school.

Curriculum and course development: Prior to 2012, my courses were face-to-face traditional lecture courses. Beginning in 2013, as an outgrowth of my involvement with my college's Blended Learning initiative, I converted four of my classes to a "flipped classroom", in which students received didactic information in short videos that they watched (and passed mastery

quizzes on) prior to coming to class. In class, students work in small (assigned) groups to conduct collaborative data analysis and interpretation on authentic, real-world data sets. As part of this transformation, I developed (i) fifty-six separate mastery quizzes (14 per course, used to prepare students for in-class collaborative exercises), (ii) 112 hours of video (prepared and revised twice) to support didactic instruction; all videos are closed-captioned, and transcripts are also provided, and (iii) an interactive decision tool for the selection of data analyses. In 2020-2021, I began to convert all of my courses from a GUI based approach (SPSS) to a coding based approach (R). Due to the 2020-2021 COVID-19 pandemic, I also converted the live portion of my classes to online delivery (Zoom), using breakout rooms to facilitate small collaboration groups.


Funded predoctoral training program and individual fellowships: From 2003-2025, I served as Principal Investigator of an NIH Institutional Predoctoral Training Grant (T32) entitled "Physical, Cognitive, and Mental Health in Social Context" (retitled as "Research Training in Non-Pharmacological Interventions for Cognition in Aging, MCI, and Alzheimer's Disease" in 2020). Originally focused around (a) search for modifiable antecedents of normal and impaired cognitive aging, (b) design and evaluation of intervention approaches to strengthen late life cognition, and (c) assessment and mitigation of negative functional consequences of cognitive aging and dementia, the 2020 refocus emphasized three broad themes in cognitive interventions with older adults: (a) behavioral interventions (e.g., cognitive training, exercise, mindfulness); (b) multi-component compensatory interventions; and (c) neuromodulation/stimulation interventions for older adults with and without MCI- and AD-related cognitive impairment Senior mentors and mentors-in-training have successfully trained our scholars for postdoctoral fellowships and subsequent research placements in settings including traditional disciplinary departments, clinical research environments, and multidisciplinary programs. Disciplines represented in this proposal include applied physiology and kinesiology, environmental gerontology/geography, geriatric medicine, linguistics, neurology, neuropsychology, neuroscience, nursing, occupational therapy, psychology, sociology, and speech pathology. Continuing core program components include (1) assignment of each student to a frequently convened multi-disciplinary mentoring team; (2) formation and close tracking of productivity goals in the areas of research, education, and service; (3) a weekly campus-wide colloquium series featuring top national speakers, local researchers in aging, and professional development; (4) required supplemental coursework and other didactics in Aging, Statistics/Methodology, Responsible Conduct of Research, and Rigor and Reproducibility. This program has trained 41 persons to date, of whom 29 (71%) were female, 13 (32%) were members of historically excluded/minority groups; in terms of subsequent placement, 28 (68%) are in primary research positions. 18 (43%) are faculty or research scientists, 2 (5%) work in research support positions (e.g., study coordinators or research administrators) and 8 (20%) are still in training. In addition, I have also supported my own students in the development and submission of their own individual predoctoral fellowship awards to NIH (F31), or related awards. Student funding has included four F31s, one R03, one R36, one AARP Fellowship, and three Diversity Supplements.
