Cancer health disparity scientist with over 25 years of experience in health disparity and minority health research, global cancer research, training of underrepresented minority biomedical workforce, and community outreach and engagement focused in underserved and minority communities.

Personal Statement of Experience

My position at University of Florida (UF) is Professor in the Colleges of Pharmacy and Medicine and Program Director of Florida-California CaRE² Health Equity Center, an NCI-funded U54 award. In addition, I am the PI and Program Director for the NCI-funded (P20 award) Florida Minority Cancer Research & Training (MiCaRT) Center. I am also the PI of the NCI-EGRP supported Prostate Cancer Transatlantic Consortium (CaPTC) and the Research Core Director for the Florida Health Equity Research Institute. My research program (primarily funded by NIH and Department of Defense) focuses on the predictors of health disparities and cost-effective, community-based behavioral interventions to improve the health of minority populations, especially Black men. I have directed over 30 research projects, including genetic-environmental determinants of prostate cancer disparity studies. My contribution to Global Health Equity dates back to 1997 and has resulted in multiple accomplishments and recognitions. As far back as 2009, my leadership in health disparities was recognized by the American Society of Health-Systems Pharmacy and the Association of Black Health-System Pharmacists with the Inaugural (1st) Leadership Award for Health Disparities. Due to my extensive experience in prostate cancer disparity research, I was selected by the US Congressionally Directed Medical Research Programs to give the inaugural Dr. Barbara Terry-Koroma Health Disparity Legacy Lecture in 2013. My effort in training underrepresented minorities for over two decades was recognized through the INSIGHT Into Diversity 2016 Inspiring Women in STEM Award. My most recent awards are the Living Legend Award for innovations with health/economic impact from the 1st All Africa Clinical Trial Summit in 2017, the 2017 Williams Award for Innovation in Cancer care in Africa from AORTIC, and the Carnegie African Diaspora Fellow Award (2017, 2018). My outstanding contributions have also been recognized at UF with my selection as UF Term Professor twice (2015-2017; 2018-2020). My NCI-supported consortium, CaPTC (<http://epi.grants.cancer.gov/captc/>), facilitates and supports recruitment and retention of minorities in biomedical research and biobanking for Black men's research globally. Overall, I have extensive (25 years) experiences in leading multi-disciplinary center grants, transatlantic collaborations, cancer control, clinical trial intervention, Black men's health research and outreach programs focused on health disparities globally. In addition, I am personally and professionally committed to eliminating cancer disparities, especially in ethnically diverse Black populations globally.

Contributions to Science

My contributions to science spans over 25 years, starting with improving practice behavior of providers to improve medication management for patients. My first and immediate contribution to science after my doctoral degree was the "*Pharmacists' Implementation of pharmaceutical Care (PIPC) Model*" to improve the practice behavior of community pharmacists. The PIPC model was the first practice model developed to change pharmacists' behavior relative to pharmaceutical care. This research led to several publications and several awards. My second contribution is empowering patients, with programs tailored to the needs of minorities (especially Black

men) to address health disparities. Using community-engagement research principles as well as interdisciplinary approach, my research program studies the embedded relationships among biological, behavioral and environmental factors, and their interactive pathways contributing to the etiology of disparity in prostate cancer risk and mortality among Black men globally. Research results are subsequently used to develop community-based and patient-centric interventions to address the social-determinants of health. Funded primarily by the NIH/National Cancer Institute and the Department of Defense, contributions to science include the development of “*Bio-behavioral model of prostate cancer risk factors for Black men*” and “*Theory-based intervention programs to address disparities*”. A third contribution to science is in the area of clinical trials implementation, including patient/public education, recruitment and retention. In the area of clinical trials, my research program focuses on oncology clinical trials for Blacks. Using the principles of implementation science to study the adoption of interventions, we develop and implement intervention trials in Black communities. In addition, we have embarked on unique initiatives to increase and improve clinical trials in Africa that includes assessment of current practices, development of technology-enhanced practices to educate the public, training of clinical trials workforce, organizing clinical trials conferences and facilitating the implementation of clinical trials in Africa.

RESEARCH EXPERIENCES

Health promotion and disease prevention

Focus has been in the area of cancer prevention and childhood immunization including:

- Individual model of prostate cancer disparities among Black men of African ancestry.
- Risk factors for prostate cancer among Black men of African ancestry.
- African-American views on prostate cancer screening.

PACHE is designed to promote and build collaborative research, training, career development and education efforts between minority serving institutions and NCI-designated cancer centers (or cancer centers with highly integrated cancer research programs). The long-term goal of the Florida CaRE² Center is to reduce cancer disparities in Blacks and Latinos, to train and increase the pool of underrepresented Black and Latino scientists conducting health disparity research, to increase research capacity at FAMU, and to increase cancer disparity research at UF and USC-NCCC.

Florida Minority Cancer Research and Training Center (MiCaRT) – 2014

- The Florida Minority Cancer Research and Training (MiCaRT) Center was established in September 2014 through the National Institutes of Health/National Cancer Institute Feasibility Studies to Build Collaborative Partnerships in Cancer Research (P20) Program, part of the NCI Partnerships to Advance Cancer Health Equity (PACHE) initiative. PACHE is designed to promote and build collaborative research, training, career development and education efforts between minority serving institutions and NCI-designated cancer centers (or cancer centers with highly integrated cancer research programs). The long-term goal of the Florida MiCaRT Center is to increase the number of underrepresented minority (URM) cancer researchers in Florida and nationally.

Florida Cancer Research Training Opportunities for Outstanding Leaders (ReTOOL) Program - 2012

- The Florida Cancer Research Training Opportunities for Outstanding Leaders (ReTOOL) Program was established in 2012 through the Department of Defense Prostate Cancer Research Program. It is now supported by multiple awards from the National Institutes of Health/National Cancer Institute. The ReTOOL program provides cancer research training opportunities for qualified underrepresented minority (URM) undergraduate and health profession students in basic, clinical, and behavioral research.

UF Health Cancer Center - Cancer Health Disparities (CHD) Program – 2011

- The CHD program was created in 2011 to facilitate a transdisciplinary and integrated approach to addressing CHD across programs at University of Florida and surrounding communities. Led by a scientific leadership team and a community advisory board, the CHD program supports the UF Health Cancer Center's mission. The primary goal of the CHD program is to integrate cancer health disparities research in population, clinical and basic sciences, and to integrate and foster education, training, community engagement and community outreach initiatives on cancer disparities.

UF Prostate Disease Center Community Outreach & Minority Affairs Program – 2010

- Developed the Florida Prostate Health Outreach Program (PHOP) to reduce the morbidity and mortality of prostate cancer in the State of Florida. The three services provided through PHOP include: [1] Community Relations to offer prostate health programs statewide; [2] **Organizations / Providers Relations** to facilitate state-wide collaborative efforts among community-based cancer organizations, providers, public and private organizations, and academic institutions by fostering partnerships; and [3] **Research Relations** to foster community-based participatory research (CBPR).

The Florida Black Men Health Consortium - 2008

- Fostered collaboration among academic institutions, community-based organizations, and the State Department of Health to develop the "Florida Black Men Health Consortium". The mission of the consortium is to "improve Black men's health, increase their life expectancy and enhance their quality of life by promoting health and reducing the disproportionate disease morbidity and mortality experienced by Black men ". This mission will be accomplished through the following activities:
 - Resource network and capacity building for Black men's health organizations.
 - Policy development for Black men's health.
 - Facilitate state-wide research program on Black men's health.
 - Comprehensive community engagement and outreach to create awareness about Black men's health.
 - Development of an interdisciplinary program for men's cancer care (MenCAN program).

The Prostate Cancer Transatlantic Collaborative (CaPTC) - 2005

- Developed the CaPTC comprising a team of scientists and clinicians from the United States (US), United Kingdom (UK), Caribbean, and West Africa.
- The CaPTC is an active research, training and community outreach collaboration with focus on the global prostate cancer problem among Black men of African ancestry. The CaPTC's research program goals are to: (i) explore and quantify the magnitude of prostate cancer morbidity and mortality variance among Black men of African ancestry; (ii) explore genetic and environmental etiology of this variance, using valid and reliable instruments and biomarkers; and (iii) develop targeted and tailored intervention to effectively address prostate cancer disparities in Black men.

US Fulbright Cancer Control Program - 2006

- As a US Fulbright Scholar to Nigeria, implemented a cancer control program in Nigeria through the Federal Ministry of Health. Accomplishments included:
 - Development of the 1st Cancer Control Plan for Nigeria.
 - The 1st national research project assessing the cancer data reporting system in Nigeria.
 - The 1st SWOT analysis for a National Cancer Registry System in Nigeria.
 - Initiation of the "National Cancer Awareness week", now celebrated as the National Cancer Awareness month in October by the Federal Ministry of Health.
 - Community engagement and outreach through national media programs.
 - Initiation of the Transatlantic Cancer Research Consortium resulting in the proposal for a Memorandum of Understanding with the Federal Ministry of Health (in collaboration with Dr. Lovell Jones of the MD Anderson Cancer Center).
 - Development of a Nigeria Cancer Data Reporting form that can be used by Nigerian cancer registries to report cancer incidence, prevalence and deaths to the Federal ministry of Health (in collaboration with Dr. Y.A. Thorpe).

Florida A&M University -Moffitt Center for Minority Prostate Cancer Training and Research - 2004

- Collaborated with the H. Lee Moffitt Cancer Center to implement the Florida A&M University Center for Minority Prostate Cancer Training and Research in 2004. The Center includes seven Moffitt Cancer Center researchers and over 15 Florida A&M University researchers.

Florida A&M University (FAMU) Pharmacoeconomics Graduate Program -1998

- Developed, implemented, and successfully secured funding for the (FAMU) graduate program in Pharmacoeconomics in 1998.
- Developed and implemented the Pharmacoeconomics graduate program curriculum.
- Secured Masters fellowship funding and research funding for graduate students.
- Three students have graduated from the Pharmacoeconomics program and six students are currently enrolled in the program.

Implementation of a Pharmacy Administration Academic Department -1997

- Instituted the Pharmacy Administration department (the Economic, Social and Administrative Pharmacy Division) at Florida A&M University College of Pharmacy.
- From just one faculty in the fall of 1997, the Economic, Social and Administrative Pharmacy (ESAP) Division now has four full-time faculty and four adjunct faculty.
